For now, we continue along the road. We will look to each other for support. We'll care for those who are hurting or need care. We'll continue to find ways to bolster our young people and the children in our community in the ways we can. Hopefully we'll look beyond our walls to see what is happening in our community and the world and do our best to address the issues. I do not know if income inequality will be the problem for the next twenty years, or will it be climate change, or homelessness, or will it be like it has always been... a combination of any number of issues with which each community must take account.

We look at the long run...and Christianity has had a long run...and I suspect that it will and we will change to meet the issues of the day. I look forward to doing that with you in this coming year.
