After helping to negotiate the sale of Chen & Associates, Don retired in 1991. He and Nona joined Friendship Force of Utah in 1994, and began hosting and participating in exchanges with clubs from all over the world. Thru Friendship Force they were enriched by the many friendships they made while traveling, staying in private homes and learning about different cultures. They especially enjoyed making new friendships while sharing their home and showing their guests the benefits of living in Utah.

In the last few years Don has been dealing with dementia brought on by the cancer in his eye orbit which required radiation treatment. He kept a good spirit and never complained. Our family would like to offer many thanks to the wonderful staff at Abbington Care Center in Murray and Canyon Hospice who were so kind and caring.

He was loved so much and will be truly missed.

Don is survived by his sister, Kathy (Gary), his wife, Nona, daughters Stephanie and Suzanne (Jim) and son Vincent (JoAnne) and grandchildren, Ivy, Amanda and Rex, stepchildren, Jeremy (Kim), Samantha and Oliver and step great grandchildren, Stella and Max.
