It is hard to write about resurrection and new life, when some days it feels like we are still sitting in the darkness of the tomb.

As I read the headlines of the news articles lately I am more dismayed at the lengths in which people will go to hide from the truth, spin a situation to look more favorable, and flat out ignore the needs of others in the world for their own gain.

Friends, we are witnessing genocide in our lifetime, but because it is not here in the continental U.S., we get to more easily turn our gaze to the kinder and more gentle things of this world. This past week I read more than 4 stories about the impending famine in Gaza. This is not an "IF", it is "when". Even the "when" isn't entirely accurate because it really is "now". People are starving to death and it is 2024. My heart aches, tears fall, and I feel lost and in death's tomb when it comes to knowing how to help. My pleas and prayers for the Almighty feel futile.

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Christ, it is only by the work of our hands and hearts that others across the globe will come to know the Good News. The reign of a Risen Christ isn't good news for the people of Gaza if their stomachs are so loud with hunger pains they cannot hear. The goodness of God is for naught if the people next door only know the abuse at the hands of their spouse, and know nothing of the hands that seek to hold and hug. The love of Jesus cannot be heard if the gunfire is so loud that it echoes in the ears of those who live in violence, too afraid to speak or share because of the sounds that may interrupt and harm.

As we have been working at 'getting up to something good' this Lent, my hope and deep prayer are that you can find just one thing to do each day that will let someone else outside your household know of God's love...not with words, but with food, hugs, and kind and listening ears; with donations to food banks, with donations to international aid funds, and with the greatest love in your heart...the love of a resurrected Christ.

On Sunday, March 17th Christ United Methodist Church presented Bob Pearce (posthumously) and Dorothy Pearce our 2024 Quiet Disciple Award. Below is the invitation to nominate that we received from the Annual Conference, and in italics, the nomination CUMC submitted.

Dear Local Church Lay Leader and/or Clergy:

This is an invitation for you to nominate someone from your church as a Quiet Disciple. In the organized church, people often get caught up in titles, training, formal recognition, and other forms of "officialdom," but a Quiet Disciple is not that. This person is one who goes about their business in ministry or service to their church or community without fanfare or necessarily filling a specific position. A Quiet Disciple is likely to be self-starting and self-directed in filling unmet needs. Frequently this person seeks no limelight or recognition but works tirelessly in the background when no one else is around. Quiet Disciples are the foundation of laity in ministry. Age should not be a factor, although this is generally considered to be a lifetime achievement award.

In recognition of exemplary service to our local congregation, we wish to nominate the following individuals for selection as the District/Subdistrict Recipient of the Quiet Disciple Award.

Dorothy and Bob Pearce (members since 1964)


Bob, who passed away in 2022, served as Scoutmaster of Troop 410 and organized countless backpacking and snowshoe adventures for scout, UMYF, and adult groups. He was a board member at Crossroads Urban Center and a Volunteer of the Year at Crossroads. He served on every committee at CUMC and was instrumental in getting solar panels on the church roof.

Dorothy has taught Sunday school to generations of children and directed a boatload of Christmas pageants. She was a Cub Scout den leader. Dorothy's visits to her new neighbors brought an unknown number of families to CUMC who themselves became lifelong members. Dorothy also received the Volunteer of the Year Award from Crossroads Urban Center.

For 20+ years Bob and Dorothy served hot cocoa to people in line for Crossroad Urban Center's Thanksgiving and Christmas food distributions, also distributing hats and scarves they had collected. Together, they taught a sex education class for the UMYF in the early 1970's. Both served as Stephen Ministers. They "adopted" several homeless individuals and a single mother over the years, offering transportation and providing basic needs. They also regularly volunteered, with Family Promise.

That ends the "official" nomination CUMC submitted to the conference. Most of the information in the nomination came from Dorothy, their daughter Kathy, and their sons Steve and Dave. However, it only scratches the surface of their influence on this congregation. Every person who had the privilege of knowing Bob has a story to tell. Every person who has ever encountered Dorothy's always joyful and selfless giving has another story to add. Dorothy says that it all happened because they liked being busy and there were things that needed doing. It is a gift that the Quiet Disciple Award offers us a chance to reflect on how much we miss Bob and how much we love and appreciate Dorothy.



The LATEST Proposed Inland Port in Weber County will harm over 8,000 acre of wetlands. We need to get more signatures for the petition opposing the implementation of the Weber County Inland Port. As well as asking the Utah Inland Port Authority to reexamine their actions and stop their plans to expand the building of warehouses throughout the state. Many like the planned expansion in Weber, Tooele and Bear River are near the Great Salt Lake and the ports will have harmful impacts on nearby bird populations as well as the human population.
