Pastor Lisa's Lines



These past two years have gone by so fast. Christ UMC will be a part of me forever. You have shaped me and changed me and I hope I have shaped and changed you. The time we had together was brief, but also a covenant that was deep and abiding. I know this change comes too soon, and I know I am still grieving leaving, but I pray that with the help of one another, you will embrace this change in pastoral leadership and continue to BE the church.

I will lead my last worship with you all Memorial Day weekend, Sunday, May 26th at 10 a.m. I know this is a holiday weekend, but I hope to see each of you before I depart. While I will still be your pastor through June, I will be on mission trip to Kenya, June 2 – 17, and then attending the Mountain Sky UMC Annual Conference in Casper Wyoming, June 19-24. In order to help with this transition we have lined up several pastors to preach in June and enjoy some fun in worship over the summer. Thank you for your understanding and grace.

In this last note to you as a congregation, I want to share a few important things about moving forward. Some of you are familiar with the United Methodist Church and some of you are not. So, as a refresher or news, here are a few things to keep in mind when it comes to pastoral transitions in the United Methodist Church:

UMC Pastors are appointed and serve at the pleasure of the Bishop on a one-year term.

July 1st is the date that pastors either return to their congregation (as I have done for the past 2 years) or move on to their new congregation. There is no guaranteed time frame for a pastor to serve, except on a year to year basis. As hard as this is, it allows for the congregation to be in community with one another and form lasting bonds with each other. The pastor is just a vessel for guidance and will change over time, but the community is forever!

UMC Pastors are not allowed to reach out to former congregants for one year after they leave an appointment.

As pastors transition out of one church and move to another, they are to follow the guidance of being out of contact with the former congregation for a year. This enables the new pastor to form relationships with the congregation and for the congregation to look to the new pastor for care and leadership. (I will love hearing <u>from</u> you via cards and social media, but I will not reach out to any of you in this first year.) If you come to Southern California, I would love to see you at Escondido First UMC. If you send cards I will be excited to read them. I will carry you all with me into this next chapter even though I will not reach out for a bit.

UMC Pastors bring and take their own traditions with them.

While I have been your pastor, I have brought with me my familial traditions from a life in ministry and it has been my joy to share them with you for a time. It will be up to the new pastor to bring new traditions, and/or keep some I have brought. I brought the ending for our Call to Worship. 90% of Sundays we ended with Psalm 118:24 – "This is the day that the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad in it!", and I end each service with a benediction that closes with, "Go and change the world." I brought the mystery box that a congregant from Montrose UMC made for me. I take it with me all spiffed up by John Jolley, a member here at Christ UMC. I take these traditions with me as familial generational traditions. Your new pastor will have other traditions to bring to you, or they might want to have their own box! Whatever the case, enjoy them for the time they are here!

UMC Pastors need your prayers and your grace.

As pastors, we are called and set apart to preach and teach, to administer sacraments, and to care for the congregation. As pastors, we are not perfect, we misspeak, misstep and make mistakes. Your prayers and your grace are necessary for the work of the church – not just as it extends to others in the church, but also how it extends to your pastor. I pray that each of you will do all in your power to uphold your next pastor and their family as they make this transition to Christ UMC. I hope you take time to pray for them regularly, and as you get to know them. May you offer your sincere forgiveness and love when they may be hurting, or may unintentionally hurt you. We all fall short of this thing we call glory – and we all need grace-filled words, handshakes and hugs. And for the ways I may have hurt you, I ask for your forgiveness. And should you need mine, please do not let me leave without asking for it. I want to extend it to you.

UMC Pastors love what they do – and love you.

We would not do what we do, if we did not love people – those inside and outside the church. It is our calling and our passion. It has been my privilege to love you and let you love me. It has been a journey that has shaped me and taught me. I will continue to hold you all in prayer after I leave and hope you do the same. As your new pastor arrives you will see people come out of the wood-work to come and 'check out' this person and their preaching. Some of these people will be people you haven't seen sitting in the pews for months or years. Love them. Let them love you. Welcome them with open arms and pretend they never left. The same will be true for people who leave because this new pastor is not their cup of tea. Allow them that decision and continue to love them. As I said in my first sermon with you in July of 2022, "I may be someone that is hard for you to learn how to love, and you may be the same for me, but that is our job – to learn to love one another like Jesus."

Transitions are difficult, but they are also a sign of growth! Grow with your new pastor, grow with one another, and let the Holy Spirit guide you in all that you do as you "serve, love, and care" for the world.

Ugh! I was angry! I watched with disappointment and disgust as three individuals pushed rocks off their natural settings down into ravines. They laughed and shouted with joy as large chunks went tumbling down with thunderous crashes. These were individuals who were old enough to know better. Maybe you saw the same thing recently on the evening news. This vandalism took place in Red Rock Canyon National Conservation area west of Las Vegas.

Watching that episode on the evening news reminded me of a passage from Genesis where God tells Adam and Eve to "be fruitful and increase in number, fill the earth and *subdue* it..." (Genesis 1:28). The Good News Bible's wording is "bring it under control." The New Living Bible says, "Fill the earth and govern it." I especially like Eugene Peterson's The Message where he translates, "Prosper! Reproduce! Fill the earth! Take charge!" Misinterpreting the Hebrew word sometimes translated as *subdue* gives the false impression that we can do what we want with the gifts God has given us. This is false.

A better translation of the Hebrew word in question might be "take charge" with the implication of our being responsible and accountable for managing and caring for this planet. The meaning is for us to be responsible managers who are concerned for the improvement and nurture of creation—our world and environment.

Watching the naïve joy of these young, misguided kids reminds me of our human tendency to think everything we see is for us to use for our pleasure and joy without thought of consequences. To do that is abusive and irresponsible. Yet we do that in so many ways. Especially when we do not consider the impact of our actions. We fail to see the bigger picture. God help us to care past ourselves not only for the sake of our environment, but also for the sake of our children and their children.

Our pursuit of happiness must go beyond the bottom line of money and short-sighted fun. Chasing after short term pleasures without consideration of how that affects our world and future generations is destructive madness.

I am grateful for our Green Team and all those who strive to see the bigger picture and work hard to get us to care. Lord, help us to listen! Help us to care! Help us be responsible!




Adult Small Group Opportunities


